Greetings from your friendly neighborhood 811 center! It's hot. Hydrate. Thanks for your time.

No seriously, we are busy during this 2024 summer and are currently running about 6% over 2023. And this is before the true release of the BEAD monies.

The impact of the infrastructure bill has yet to be felt throughout NC and meanwhile there is plenty of work being done across the state. The general word on the street is that locators are being hired and trained to meet demand (a few hundred in the Raleigh market alone) but hiring and training takes time... The patience of excavators with the process is appreciated! Of course that goodwill can only extend so far. We are working as a group to establish changes to be introduced for the 2025 session. Although NC 811 does not have a dog directly in the fight we do work to help coordinate the discussions, keep notes and distribute redlined versions of the law. The goal is to have this language prepared for bill writers no later than November 1.

This is likely going to involve some give and take between the parties. My encouragement is always to measure any changes against existing laws, especially the ones recently passed, to identify how common specific aspects of the language (ticket length (currently 15 working days in NC), tolerance zone (currently 24 inches in NC), white lining requirements and other items already are in practice. The focus must always be on safety and how we can help to streamline the process to allow it to work as designed. This means excavators calling in exactly what is needed for the appropriate time frame, locators responding within the legally required time frame and ultimately safe digging around facilities.

I always know I am preaching to the choir here but spread the word: <u>safe digging is a shared respon-</u> sibility.

We see damages continue to rise in the state as well as an update percentage north of 30%.

I look forward to a much cooler experience in October with you all at Grove Park! Stay safe, stay cool and always reach out if there is something I can help with!

Our notifications have been on the rise since dig season started. In May, compared to last year, we had a 766 increase in notifications. This upward trend continued in June, with 833 more notifications compared to the previous year. We will continue to monitor these differences throughout the year. We still maintain Electric, Fiber, and Cable TV as the most common dig projects in South Carolina, followed closely by Telephone Work. The areas seeing the highest volume of these projects are Greenville, Richland, Spartanburg, Charleston, and Horry County.



We are excited for our inaugural 811 Day on August 11th. We will be hosting our Family Fun Day in Greenville this year and have invited our employees, staff, and board members to join us in celebrating.

# **YOUNG LEADERS CLAY SHOOT**















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



### 2024 Washington Summit: Highlights and News

NUCA's annual Washington Summit held May 22-23 once again delivered real results for our association and our industry. Our 106 attendees discussed our several top issues in a record-setting 107 meetings with House and Senate lawmakers and staffers. Those our attendees met with in Congress were very open to the association's legislative goals, and we expect this year's Summit to deliver dividends into the session ahead. We are optimistic that the two State Revolving Funds will be fully funded for FY2025, but work remains ahead over the summer months and possibly into fall before final numbers are determined.

### NUCA of Colorado Scores Big Legislative Win

Our Colorado chapter reports that the chapter and the state's utility construction industry scored a big legislative win when Gov. Jared Polis vetoed a bill May 17 that would have unfairly penalized contractors for wage violations committed by subcontractors. "This bill [HB 1008]...would let subcontractors who fail to pay their workers off the hook, do little if anything to prevent additional wage theft, and penalize good actors who pay all their workers on time," wrote the governor. NUCA of Colorado and other state business organizations conducted a brilliant advocacy campaign against the bill, convincing Polis to veto the measure. Congratulations to NUCA of Colorado for their hard work and success!

### Federal Infrastructure Investment is Behind Schedule

Members will not be surprised to learn that the rollout of federal utility infrastructure investment is proceeding slower than expected. According to a new analysis compiled by Politico, of the \$1.1 trillion in direct federal infrastructure, climate, and energy investment passed since 2021, less than 17% has been spent. Only a small fraction of funding from the landmark 2021 infrastructure law has made it to projects – mostly surface transportation work – and nearly all of the critical funding for water and wastewater infrastructure, broadband, and other key programs remain unspent.


### **EPA Clean Water Survey Released**

The EPA released in mid-May the latest need for investment to meet Clean Water Act water quality objectives over the next 20 years. The "2022 Clean Watershed Needs Survey" (CWNS) released May 14 is reporting that there are \$630.1 billion needs in clean water infrastructure for improved or new wastewater, stormwater, wastewater treatment, and nonpoint source control. \$347.7 billion in wastewater needs include repairing existing pipes and pump stations. Six states--New York, California, Florida, Virginia, Louisiana, and Georgia--accounted for 42% of nationwide needs. The last CWNS was released in 2012. ### EPA Releases \$9 Billion For Lead Pipe Replacement

The EPA announced on May 2 that the agency will distribute \$3 billion annually over the next three years to replace an estimated 1.7 million lead service lines in the United States. The resources were authorized by the 2021 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and will be distributed via the EPA's Drinking Water SRF. The Biden Administration said in its announcement that this will build upon their "Lead and Pipe Action Plan", which will send 50% of this funding to disadvantaged communities. There are more than 9 million lead service lines in the U.S. that will need to be replaced at an estimated cost of \$50 billion.





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
